

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN FERRY COUNTY, WASHINGTON
AND KITTITAS COUNTY, WASHINGTON, FOR THE HOUSING OF INMATES**

THIS INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT is made and entered into on this ____ day of _____, 20__ by and between Kittitas County, Washington, hereinafter referred to as “Kittitas County”, and Ferry County, Washington, hereinafter referred to as “Ferry County”, each party having been duly organized and now existing under the laws of the State of Washington.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Ferry County Corrections and the Kittitas County Sheriff are authorized by law to have charge and custody of the County Jail and the County prisoners or inmates, respectively; and

WHEREAS, Kittitas County wishes to designate Ferry County Corrections as a place of confinement for the incarceration of one or more inmates lawfully committed to its custody; RCW 70.48: and

WHEREAS, Ferry County Corrections is desirous of accepting and keeping in custody such inmate(s) in the Ferry County Corrections for a rate of compensation mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto; and

WHEREAS, RCW 39.34, 70.48, and other Washington law, as amended, authorizes any city/county to contract with any other city/county to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which each contracting city/county is authorized by law to perform; and

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of each of the parties hereto have determined to enter into this Agreement as authorized and provided for by RCW 39.34, 70.48, and other Washington law, as amended,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the above and foregoing recitals, the payments to be made, the mutual promises and covenants herein contained, and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. GOVERNING LAW

The parties hereto agree that, except where expressly otherwise provided, the laws and administrative rules and regulations of the State of Washington shall govern in any matter relating to an inmate(s) confined pursuant to this Agreement.

2. DURATION

This Agreement shall enter into full force and effect from January 1, 2012 and end December 31, 2012, subject to earlier termination as provided by Section 3 herein. This agreement shall be renewed automatically for like successive periods under such terms and conditions as the parties may determine. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to require Kittitas County to house inmates at Ferry County Corrections continuously.

Notices mailed shall be deemed given on the date mailed. The Parties shall notify each other in writing of any change of address.

5. DEFINITIONS

The Parties hereby agree that the following terms shall have the specified meanings unless indicated otherwise herein:

(a) Day. A twenty-four hour-long unit of time commencing at 00:00:01 a.m., and ending 23:59:59 p.m.

(b) Inmate Classifications shall be pursuant to the Ferry County Corrections Objective Jail Inmate Classification System which is modeled after the National Institute of Corrections Jail Classification System:

(i) "Minimum" classification shall apply to those inmates who present a low risk to staff and the community.

(ii) "Medium" classification shall apply to those inmates who present a moderate risk to staff and the community.

(iii) "Maximum" classification shall apply to those inmates who present a substantial risk to staff and the community.

6. COMPENSATION

(a) Rates. Ferry County Corrections agrees to accept and house Kittitas County inmates for compensation per inmate at the rate of \$48.00 per day (also see #12 below). This includes minimum and medium classification inmates. The parties agree that Ferry County Corrections will not charge a separate booking fee in addition to such rate. The date of booking into Ferry County Corrections of Kittitas County inmates, no matter how little time of a twenty-four hour day it constitutes, shall count as one day and shall be billed to Kittitas County as a day of custody in Ferry County. The date of release from Ferry County and/or returned to Kittitas County, no matter how much of a twenty-four hour day it constitutes, shall not be billed by Ferry County against Kittitas County.

(b) Billing and payment. Ferry County Corrections agrees to provide Kittitas County with an itemized bill listing all names of inmates who are housed, the case/citation number, the number of days housed (including the date and time of booking and date and time of release), and the dollar amount due for each. Ferry County Corrections agrees to provide said bill by the 10th of each month. Kittitas County agrees to make payment to Ferry County Corrections within 30 days of receipt of such bill for the amount billed for the previous calendar month.

7. RIGHT OF INSPECTION

Kittitas County shall have the right to inspect, at all reasonable times, Ferry County Corrections facilities in which inmates of Kittitas County are confined in order to determine if such jail maintains standards of confinement acceptable to Kittitas County and that such inmates therein are treated equally regardless of race, religion, color,

creed or national origin; provided, however, that Ferry County Corrections shall be obligated to manage, maintain and operate its facilities consistent with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations.

8. FURLOUGHS, PASSES, AND WORK RELEASE

Ferry County agrees that no early releases or alternatives to incarceration, including furloughs, passes, work crews, electronic home detention or work release shall be granted to any inmate housed pursuant to this Agreement without written authorization by the committing court.

9. INMATE ACCOUNTS

Ferry County Corrections shall establish and maintain an account for each inmate received from Kittitas County and shall credit to such account all money which is received and shall make disbursements, debiting such accounts in accurate amounts for the inmate's personal needs. Disbursements shall be made in limited amounts as are reasonably necessary for personal maintenance. Ferry County Corrections shall be accountable to Kittitas County for such inmate funds. At either the termination of this Agreement, the inmate's death, and release from incarceration or return to either Kittitas County or indefinite release to the court, the inmate's money shall be transferred to the inmate's account in care of Kittitas County; at such time Kittitas County shall be accountable to the inmate for said funds.

10. INMATE PROPERTY

Kittitas County may transfer to Ferry County only agreed amounts of personal property of Kittitas County inmates recovered from or surrendered by inmates to Kittitas County upon booking.

11. RESPONSIBILITY FOR OFFENDER'S CUSTODY

It shall be the responsibility of Ferry County to confine the inmate or inmates; to provide treatment, including the furnishing of subsistence and all necessary medical and hospital services and supplies; to provide for the inmates' physical needs; to make available to them programs and/or treatment consistent with the individual needs; to retain them in said custody; to supervise them; to maintain proper discipline and control; to make certain that they receive no special privileges and that the sentence and orders of the committing court in the State are faithfully executed; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to require Ferry County, or any of its agents, to provide service, treatment, facilities or programs for any inmates confined pursuant to this Agreement, which it does not provide for similar inmates not confined pursuant to this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed as to require Ferry County to provide services, treatment, facilities or programs to Kittitas County inmates above, beyond or in addition to that which is required by applicable law.

12. MEDICAL SERVICES

(a) Inmates deemed Kittitas County inmates shall receive such medical, psychiatric and dental treatment when **emergent** and necessary to safeguard their health while housed in Ferry County. Ferry County shall provide or arrange for the providing of such medical, psychiatric and dental services. Except for routine minor medical services provided in the Ferry County Corrections, Kittitas County shall pay directly or reimburse Ferry County for any and all costs associated with the delivery of any emergency and/or major medical service provided to Kittitas County inmates. Kittitas County shall be responsible for any and all **emergent** medical, dental and

psychiatric treatment provided outside of Ferry County Corrections and shall be billed therefore.

(b) An adequate record of all such services shall be kept by Ferry County for Kittitas County's review at its request, to the extent consistent with confidentiality regulations. Any medical or dental services of major consequence shall be reported to Kittitas County as soon as time permits.

(c) Should medical, psychiatric or dental services require hospitalization, Kittitas County agrees to compensate Ferry County dollar for dollar any amount expended or cost incurred in providing the same; provided that, except in emergencies, Kittitas County will be notified by contacting the duty supervisor at Kittitas County prior to the inmate's transfer to a hospital, if and when circumstances allow, or as soon afterward as practicable.

13. DISCIPLINE

Ferry County shall have physical control over and power to execute disciplinary authority over all inmates of Kittitas County. However, nothing contained herein shall be construed to authorize or permit the imposition of a type of discipline prohibited by applicable law.

14. RECORDS AND REPORTS

(a) Kittitas County shall forward to Ferry County before or at the time of delivery of each inmate; a copy of all inmate records pertaining to the inmate's present incarceration. If additional information is requested regarding a particular inmate, the parties shall mutually cooperate to provide any additional information in a timely manner.

(b) Ferry County shall keep all necessary and pertinent records concerning such inmates in the manner mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto. During an inmate's confinement in Ferry County, Kittitas County shall upon request be entitled to receive and be furnished with copies of any report or record associated with said inmate(s) incarceration.

15. REMOVAL FROM THE JAIL

An inmate of Kittitas County legally confined in Ferry County shall not be removed there from by any person without written authorization from Kittitas County or by order of any court having jurisdiction. Kittitas County hereby designates the Corrections Lieutenant as the official authorized to direct Ferry County to remove Kittitas County inmates from Ferry County Corrections. Ferry County agrees that no early releases or alternatives to incarceration, including furloughs, passes, work release, work crews or electronic home detention shall be granted to any inmate without written authorization from the committing court. This paragraph shall not apply to an emergency necessitating the immediate removal of the inmate for medical, dental, psychiatric treatment or other catastrophic condition presenting an eminent danger to the safety of the inmate or to the inmates or personnel of Ferry County. In the event of any such emergency removal, Ferry County shall inform Kittitas County of the whereabouts of the inmate or inmates so removed, at the earliest practicable time, and shall exercise all reasonable care for the safe keeping and custody of such inmate or inmates.

16. ESCAPES

In the event any Kittitas County inmate escapes from Ferry County's custody, Ferry County will use all reasonable means to recapture the inmate. The escape shall be reported immediately to Kittitas County. Ferry County shall have the primary responsibility for and authority to direct the pursuit and retaking of the inmate or inmates within its own territory. Any cost in connection therewith shall be chargeable to and borne by Ferry County; however, Ferry County shall not be required to expend unreasonable amounts to pursue and return inmates from other counties, states or other countries.

17. DEATH OF AN INMATE

- (a) In the event of the death of a Kittitas County inmate, the Ferry County Coroner shall be notified. Kittitas County shall receive copies of any records made at or in connection with such notification.
- (b) Ferry County shall immediately notify Kittitas County of the death of a Kittitas County inmate furnish information as requested and follow the instructions of Kittitas County with regard to the disposition of the body. Kittitas County hereby designates the Correction Lieutenant and the Undersheriff as the officials authorized to request information from and provide instructions to Ferry County regarding deceased inmates. The body shall not be released except on written order of said appropriate official(s) of Kittitas County. Written notice shall be provided within three weekdays of receipt by Kittitas County of notice of such death. All expenses relative to any necessary preparation of the body and shipment charges shall be paid by Kittitas County. With Kittitas County's consent, Ferry County may arrange for burial and all matters related or incidental thereto, and all such expenses shall be paid by Kittitas County. The provisions of this paragraph shall govern only the relations between or among the parties hereto and shall not affect the liability of any relative or other person for the disposition of the deceased or for any expenses connected therewith.
- (c) Kittitas County shall receive a certified copy of the death certificate for any of its inmates who have died while in Ferry County's custody.

18. RETAKE OF INMATES

Upon request from Ferry County, Kittitas County shall, at its expense, retake any Kittitas County inmate within thirty-six (36) hours after receipt of such request. In the event the confinement of any Kittitas County inmate is terminated for any reason, Kittitas County shall, at its expense, retake such inmate at the Ferry County Correctional Facility.

19. Housing Kittitas County Inmates:

Ferry County shall not house any Kittitas County inmates with any sex offenders, maximum inmates, or anyone with a pending Class A Felony. Kittitas County inmates will be housed with like classification inmates from Ferry County or any other County located in the jail.

20. HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFICATION

Ferry County agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend Kittitas County, its officers, agents and employees, from and against any and all claims, losses, or liability, for injuries, sickness or death of persons, or damage to property, arising out of any willful misconduct or negligent act, error, or omission of Ferry County, its officers, agents, or employees, in connection with the services required by this agreement, provided, however, that:

(a) Ferry County's obligations to indemnify, defend and hold harmless shall not extend to injuries, sickness, death or damage caused by or resulting from the sole willful misconduct or negligence of Kittitas County, its agents, officers, employees or sub-consultants; and

(b) Ferry County's obligations to indemnify, defend and hold harmless for injuries, sickness, death or damage caused by or resulting from the concurrent negligence or willful misconduct of Ferry County and Kittitas County or of Ferry County and a third party other than an officer, agent or employee of Ferry County, shall apply only to the extent of the negligence or willful misconduct of Ferry County.

21. RIGHT OF REFUSAL AND TRANSPORTATION

(a) Ferry County shall have the right to refuse to accept any inmate from Kittitas County when, in the opinion of Ferry County, its inmate census is at capacity that there is a substantial risk that, through usual operation of the jail, the reasonable operational capacity limits of the jail might be reached or exceeded.

(b) Ferry County shall further have the right to refuse to accept any inmate from Kittitas County who, in the judgment of Ferry County, has a current illness or injury which may adversely affect the operations of the Ferry County Corrections, has a history of serious medical problems, presents a substantial risk of escape, or presents a substantial risk of injury to other persons or property, or is classified as a maximum security inmate pursuant to Ferry County's Objective Jail Classification System.

(c) Kittitas County prisoners incarcerated in Ferry County pursuant to this Agreement shall be transported to Ferry County by and at the expense of Ferry County and shall be returned, if necessary, to Kittitas County by Ferry County personnel and at Ferry County's expense provided that notice of the necessity of transport is received by Ferry County three (3) days prior to time of expected transport.

22. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

In providing services under this contract, Ferry County Corrections is an independent contractor and neither it nor its officers, agents or employees are employees of Kittitas County for any purpose, including responsibility for any federal or state tax, industrial insurance or Social Security liability. Neither shall the provision of services under this Agreement give rise to any claim of career service or civil service rights, which may accrue to an employee of Kittitas County under any applicable law, rule or regulation.

23. GENERAL PROVISIONS

(a) Severability. In the event any provisions of this Agreement shall be determined to be unenforceable or otherwise invalid for any reason, such provisions shall be enforced and valid to the extent permitted by law. All provisions of this

Agreement are severable and the unenforceability or invalidity of a single provision herein shall not effect the remaining provisions.

(b) Governing Law and Venue. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Washington and venue for any lawsuit shall be compliant with RCW 36.01.050.

(c) Attorney's Fees. In the event it is necessary for either party to utilize the services of an attorney to enforce any of the terms or this Agreement, such enforcing party shall be entitled to compensation for its reasonable attorney's fees and costs. In the event of litigation regarding any terms of this Agreement, the substantially prevailing party shall be entitled, in addition to other relief, to such reasonable attorney's fees and costs as determined by the Court.

(d) Waiver of Breach. The waiver by either party of the breach of any provision of this Agreement by the other party must be in writing and shall not operate nor be construed as a waiver of any subsequent breach by such other party.

(e) Savings Clause. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed so as to require the commission of any act contrary to law, and wherever there is any conflict between any provisions of this Agreement and any statute, law, public regulation or ordinance, the latter shall prevail, but in such event, the provisions of this Agreement affected shall be curtailed and limited only the extent necessary to bring it within legal requirements.

(f) Filing. This Agreement shall be filed with the Ferry County Auditor's Office or, alternatively, listed by subject on each or either party's web site or other electronically retrievable public source, pursuant to RCW 39.34.040.

(g) Administrator. As per RCW 39.34.030(4)(a). Undersheriff Clay Myers.

(h) Property. Unless otherwise specifically agreed by the parties in writing, all property, personal and real, utilized by the parties hereto in the execution of this Agreement shall remain the property of that party initially owning it.

24. INTERPRETATION

This Agreement has been submitted to the scrutiny of all parties and their counsel, if desired, and it shall be given a fair and reasonable interpretation in accordance with its words, without consideration or weight given to its being drafted by any party or its counsel. All words used in the singular shall include the plural; the present tense shall include the future tense; and the masculine gender shall include the feminine and neuter gender.

25. ACCESS TO RECORDS CLAUSE

The parties hereby agree that authorized representatives of the parties shall have access to any books, documents, paper and record of the other party which are pertinent to this Agreement for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts and transcriptions. All such records and all other records pertinent to this Agreement and work undertaken pursuant to this Agreement shall be retained by the parties for a period of three years after the final expiration date of this Agreement or any amendments hereto, unless a longer period is required to resolve audit, findings or

litigation. In such cases, the parties may expressly agree by an amendment or separate agreement for such longer period for record retention.

26. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement represents the entire integrated Agreement between Kittitas County and Ferry County Corrections and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral.
